SAFETY CONCERNS / TRAFFIC ISSUES



As mentioned in a recent Sentral post, we have recently seen an increase in the number of parents parking illegally in NO STOPPING ZONES or Disabled Parking Spots.

We appreciate that there will always be traffic and parking issues at 3.30pm due to the high volume of students leaving both Tyabb PS and Flinders College. With patience the traffic is always clear by 3.50pm. We urge you to consider your children's safety and the safety of others when you are dropping off and picking up from the school by considering the following:



- Please obey all parking restrictions and signage including NO STOPPING zones. Parents are not permitted to park
 opposite the school and crossing this road is extremely dangerous for both you and your child. NO STOPPPING zones
 are there to keep people safe and are fully enforced with fines given when breached.
- Obey the 5 minute parking rule at the front of our school between 3.30 4.00pm. Stress to your child to 'watch and wait' so you do not need to get out of the car to look for your child. A speedy changeover of cars improves the flow of traffic.
- Please do not stop and wait in the middle of Jones Road for a spot. This blocks the flow of traffic. If there is not a parking spot please keep moving along to see if there are spots further on. Parents often stop when there are spots further on. If there is not a spot continue along Jones Road, turn around and come back for another attempt. To turn around you must drive around McLaurin Drive and turn back on to Jones Road or continue to the Bungower roundabout

DISABLED PARKING — IT IS ILLEGAL TO STOP OR PARK IN A DISABLED PARKING SPOT WITHOUT A PERMIT



We currently have two parking spots at the front of our school designated for disabled parking. These are clearly marked with both a painted symbol and sign. A disabled parking space can only be used by someone who has been issued with a blue / white disabled parking permit displayed prominently in the vehicle. Parking in these spaces without a permit is illegal and can lead to a significant on the spot fine. We appreciate that parking spots are limited at our school but need to ask that you be considerate of our parents and visitors with disabilities that limit their access in to our school.










100 AND 200 NIGHTS OF READING

Classroom Capers

Grade 2A have been learning so much this term and we are excited to be filling our classroom with colourful artworks, and projects we have been working on.

Celebrating Indigenous People, Culture and Histories

Last week we began our Indigenous Studies Inquiry Unit, with a focus on National Reconciliation Week and National Sorry Day. We have been learning about the rich history, culture and connection to the land of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

We learnt more about "Welcome to Country", what it means and it's significance to both Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. We also reflected on significance of 'Sorry Day'.

Procedural Writing—We are learning about 'Procedural Writing' this week. We blended science and writing to design, make and test a parachute that would help our 'teddy' land safely. We made and modified our designs, learning all about air resistance in the process. It was lots of fun, especially eating 'teddy' at the end.







Super Subtraction Strategies

We have been learning about the many strategies we can use when solving subtraction problems such as 'jump strategy', 'split strategy' and 'vertical subtraction'. The children can't wait to come home and show their families what they've learnt. Better brush up on your subtraction skills, the kids love teaching the grown ups a thing or two.:-)

Science

On the 10th of May, Grade 6 had an incredible opportunity to get up close and personal with some zebrafish from Monash University. Students investigated the question are zebra fish an appropriate model to use for studying the human body and human



Students had the opportunity to examine real adult zebrafish as well as transparent embryos in various stages of development under a microscope.



They analysed research which outlined the similarities and differences that the fish have with human beings. We found that zebrafish share 73% of genes with humans and are actually quite comparable to humans in terms of their organs and development.



Overall, it was an enriching experience which exposed students to the world of biomedical research. We are grateful to our presenter from Monash, Elissa, for sharing her knowledge and enthusiasm with us.

Division Cross Country
